

Mini pilgrimage for charity

THE EASTBOURNE Mini Club has organised a Mini Pilgrimage to raise money for a charity which supports people who suffer from a rare infection a member's daughter caught during giving birth at the DGH.

Korinne Dell, 19, caught necrotising fasciitis, an airborne bacterial infection which eats the flesh, two years ago when she gave birth to a healthy baby girl.

The members of the club will be driving their Minis from Beachy Head to the Kent and Canterbury Hospital to raise money for the Lee Spark NF Foundation, which was set up to support the sufferers of and medical staff who deal with, necrotising fasciitis. Lisa Dell, Korinne's mother said, "They say you have more chance of winning the lottery than catching it."

The Mini Pilgrimage takes place on June 29. During the drive, passengers can take part in a quiz and there will be
